

## SUMERNET Phase 3 Learning Forum

8-10 November, Eastin Grand Hotel Sathorn, Bangkok, Thailand

Version: 6<sup>th</sup> November 2017

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### Introduction

The Mekong Region has been undergoing a socio-economic and ecological transformation over the past three decades with rapid economic growth, increased regional economic integration, and a gradual shift towards more open political systems and the emergence of liberalized market economies. However, poverty and social inequality – including gender inequality – remain major concerns and impediments for the regional countries' governments in meeting the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Environmental degradation is bringing into question the long-term sustainability of ecosystems and their services, as rapid economic growth with its emphasis on exploitation of natural resources for economic gain has led to degradation of ecosystems and loss of local livelihoods. Competition for limited natural resources are transboundary and regional.

The policy choices and decisions made today are thus crucial to ensure that the sustainable development goals (SDGs) are achieved towards achieving socially inclusive, equitable and sustainable development in the region.

The Sustainable Mekong Research Network (SUMERNET), a regional research network, was launched in 2005 to provide scientifically robust and policy-relevant research to inform policy decisions. Over the past decade, SUMERNET has brought together nearly 70 partners across the region, to lead interdisciplinary, cross-national studies on major policy issues; engage with policy-makers, planners and stakeholders; and build capacity among both researchers and policy-makers.

In the current Phase 3 (2014-2017), SUMERNET has been directly supporting Mekong researchers and engaging with boundary partners (i.e. policy influencers and policy makers) under 7 multi-country policy research projects, 5 national case studies that are Mekong regional-wide to deliver credible scientific knowledge while informing relevant policies and dialogues at sub-national, national and regional levels.

In the upcoming phase, "SUMERNET 4 All" (2018 – 2022), the aim is to continue work as a regional research network to help improve policy and practices in reducing water insecurities for all, in particular for the poor, marginalized and socially vulnerable groups of women and men in the Mekong Region. Successful stories and lessons learnt during the past years by SUMERNET members and partners are valuable resources for SUMERNET to design future activities e.g. conducting collaborative research, engaging with the policy process, and promoting scientifically sound research and innovation, while taking gender and social equity, human rights, environmental integrity and poverty reduction into account.

### Phase 3 Learning Forum

SUMERNET Phase 3 Learning Forum in 2017 is planned to occur over 3 days covering the following events:

- **Wed 8<sup>th</sup> November 2017: Knowledge Sharing and Lessons Learnt from SUMERNET Phase 3 (Members' and Partners' Meeting)**  
*The participants including SUMERNET members, advisors and boundary partners will share and exchange insights from different research projects and case studies in terms of new knowledge, success stories, lessons learnt and seeking possibility for future collaborations*
- **Thu 9<sup>th</sup> November 2017: Policy-Research Interactions in SUMERNET 4 All (Policy Forum)**  
*Policy actors and researchers will undertake a series of open dialogues and discussions on the challenges and needs for scientific research and knowledge to support and fill gaps in the development of robust and inclusive policy and practices related to water insecurity. This will be based on recent findings from water policy reviews and gender assessment in the Mekong Region*

under three research themes: (1) Water access, rights & allocation in times of scarcity, (2) Governance and management of flood disaster risk, and (3) Transboundary interactions with water systems.

- **Fri 10<sup>th</sup> November, SUMERNET Training on Robust Decision System (optional)**  
Participants including SUMERNET members and boundary partners will be exposed to the concepts, processes and practical applications of the Robust Decision System (RDS) framework in addressing uncertainties in water resources management in the Mekong Region. Example tools to be demonstrated and discussed include Water Evaluation and Planning System (WEAP), RDS Lite, and Tableau, that can be used in the RDS framework. Opportunities to apply the RDS framework for future regional assessment under SUMERNET 4 All will be explored.
