## Background

Like the Mekong River that binds its six nations, the **Sustainable Mekong Research Network (SUMERNET, [www.sumernet.org](http://www.sumernet.org))** nourishes a growing community of researchers that aim to inform and influence sustainable development in the Mekong Region. Ten years since its establishment in 2005, and through three phases, SUMERNET has now grown into an influential research network that consists of more than 60 institutional affiliates across the countries of the Mekong Region and Southeast Asia.

**Phase 1 (2005 - 2008)** established SUMERNET as an independent, regionally-owned platform that built a "voice" to influence regional policy. SUMERNET Phase I had many positive impacts for its partners (both individuals and their institutions) in terms of capacity-building through both training and research, as well as promotion of cross-border linkages.

**Phase 2 (2010 - 2013)** continued on the basis of building policy-relevant and collaborative projects among the researchers in the Mekong Region. In this phase, SUMERNET invested its resources to develop the capacity of researchers by incorporating the mentoring support of a larger and more diverse research project team. The mentoring support was highly appreciated by our partners, as they benefited from the expertise, and improved the credibility of their research results and the quality of the research outputs.

**In the current Phase 3 (2014 – 2017)**, with the continued funding support of the Swedish Government through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) and additional funding from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) through the Lower Mekong Public Policy Initiative (LMPPI), SUMERNET has now established a successful and expanding regional research network with expertise in several policy areas critical to sustainability.

Building upon the foundation of its previous phases, SUMERNET is in a strategic position to inform and influence policy-making in the Mekong Region towards more socially inclusive and gender-responsive sustainable development. Seven cross-country collaborative research projects and five assessment case studies are in ongoing implementation by researchers and regional assessment partners from more than 20 national teams across the Mekong Region and Southeast Asia.

This year's Annual Meeting 2016 is therefore special as we celebrate the tenth year anniversary of the founding of SUMERNET.

The Annual Meeting 2016 will bring together research partners, research mentors, regional assessment partners, SUMERNET regional assessment advisory committee (SRAAC), boundary

partners, members of SUMERNET Steering Committee (SSC), policy actors and experts, donors, and media to share their knowledge and experience on key sustainable development issues. The Annual Meeting will highlight SUMERNET's role in the region, and the changes and impacts of the network and partners at different levels.

The following events will take place during the Annual Meeting 2016:

## 1. **26<sup>th</sup> January 2016: Stories of Change from the Mekong Region: SUMERNET 10th Anniversary Celebration and Policy Forum**

The special theme of the Annual Meeting 2016 is **“Stories of Change from the Mekong Region.”** The meeting will highlight the various positive impacts of SUMERNET research and activities in the Mekong Region towards realising our vision of sustainable development. The stories will be drawn from the last 10 years and include reflections by our partners on the individual, organisation or community, and national or regional impacts.

Prior to the event, the SUMERNET Secretariat launched a “call for impact stories”. The authors of some of the stories will be requested to participate in the **“impact panel (Panel 1)”** alongside other invited, senior guest speakers.

A booklet has been produced that features the ten impact stories while there will also be a gallery of ten photos displayed in the morning of 26<sup>th</sup> January. (Some of the selected partners/network members whose stories feature in the panel will be provided support for their participation in the panel.)

The “Policy Forum” in the afternoon will encourage reflections on our work at the science–policy interface. Boundary partners and research partners from the current projects and regional assessment case studies of SUMERNET and other networks will also discuss their work in plenary and parallel panel discussions.

The Policy Forum will include plenary and break-out sessions under the following four sub-themes:

- The values of conserving and restoring wetland services **(Panel 2)**
- Trade-offs and synergies between climate and other considerations in development **(Panel 3)**
- Living well in corridors and borders **(Panel 4)**
- ASEAN/EU-SUSTAIN Panel **(Panel 5)**
- Drought in the Mekong: A new normal? **(Panel 6)**

The 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration and the Policy Forum will be attended by SUMERNET research and regional assessment partners, research mentors, SUMERNET regional assessment advisory committee (SRAAC), boundary partners, SSC, Secretariat, regional partners and donor agencies (ADB, USAID, Sida, etc.), other networks (LMPPI, M-POWER, ASEAN/EU-SUSTAIN etc.), relevant Thai government officials, media, and others in the region.

## 2. **27<sup>th</sup> January 2016: SUMERNET Research and Regional Assessment Partners Meeting**

The Research and Regional Assessment Partners Meeting aims to update the network on the progress of seven research projects and five regional assessment case studies supported by SUMERNET and LMPPI in terms of research activities, initial findings, and achievement of intended outcomes. The partners will receive valuable feedback and inputs from other research and assessment teams, mentors, SRAAC, Secretariat and SSC.

To promote gender mainstreaming into research and regional assessment activities, informative and practical tutorial session on “*Integrating gender into research and regional assessment case studies*” will be held to guide the partners in this event.

The research partner meeting will be attended by all research and regional assessment partners, boundary partners, mentors, SRAAC, Secretariat, and SSC.

### 3. 27<sup>th</sup> late afternoon – 28<sup>th</sup> January 2016: Writing workshop

The objective of the writing workshop is to guide the research and regional assessment teams on the research writing techniques to assist them in producing their written outputs including book chapter (draft) and peer-reviewed papers for journal publication. The research and regional assessment teams can use the writing workshop to identify the key issues and challenges that they face in research writing and seek the advice and support of experienced and widely published authors and mentors at the workshop.
